Dear Clients:

The Governor issued the attached letter today clarifying that Executive Order N-29-20, which is the source of the Brown Act flexibility for teleconferencing during the pandemic, remains in effect until further notice and will not automatically terminate on June 15 when the Blueprint for a Safer Economy is anticipated to terminate. As the letter indicates, the Governor's office will provide advance notice of termination of the Order so that agencies can plan for an "orderly return to the ordinary conduct of public meetings."

It is possible that future legislative action may incorporate into the Brown Act some of the features of the Executive Order on a permanent basis. We will update you on any developments in that regard as they occur.
